**The Bailiff:** Through your counsel, you have accepted the conclusions of the Attorney General, which does you credit; you have obviously felt remorse for what has happened. It is a serious offence of course - I refer to blackmail - and in a recent case we imposed a very severe sentence - though of course that is under appeal. It is a serious offence, but we note what your counsel says, and I repeat it is to your credit that you pleaded guilty and indeed accept the conclusions asked for.

You are therefore sentenced, in accordance with the conclusions of the Attorney General, on Count 1 to 1 month; on Count 2 to 1 month, concurrent; on Count 3 to 12 months, concurrent.
