THE BAILIFF: With some hesitation, (but on the other side of your hesitation, Mr Attorney) we are going to grant bail. We think the delay is inevitable, but it is rather a long time and the real test is: will he turn up for his trial and we have no doubt that he will. There is this risk which you have mentioned of committing further offences. Aubert, if you commit any further offences when we give you bail, you will be locked up right away and there you will stay until your trial. You understand that? We grant you £200 bail and you are to report weekly to the police by arrangement with them.
