JUDG MENT

BAILIFF: Miss Nicolle, Mr Le Marquand, there isn't very much we can do. The full Court gave Campbell the help we felt we were able to give him last year. We cannot go on doing it. It highlights once again the slow progress being made towards providing proper accommodation for persons who drink like this and who seem to be set on a life of drink in society. Sending them to prison will not cure them, but on the other hand they commit offences and there comes a time when they have to go to prison. It would be far better for society if there were a secure place, or a place semi-secure, where they could live and be kept an eye on, but we do not have it yet. We •

think the conclusions are right and proper and, Campbell, you are sentenced to a total of nine months' imprisonment - seven and nine concurrent.
