JUDGMENT

BAILIFF: This is an application by Kenneth Leonard Skinner and his wife alleging that Terence John Le Main, his wife and his company are in contempt of Court. That is, of course, an offence against public justice and it requires to be proved beyond reasonable doubt. The Jurats have been advised by me last night that they would have to approach the case in that light and they decided, and I agree with them, that the case does not fall within that category at all. The Jurats are quite satisfied that the case has not been proved by the plaintiffs' witnesses beyond reasonable doubt. That being so, there is no purpose in wasting your time, Mr. Fielding, or the defendants' time, in hearing the defendants' case because the case has not been made out by the plaintiffs. Therefore the representation is dismissed and the plaintiffs will pay the taxed costs.
