JUDG MENT

THE BAILIFF: Dealing with Smith first, we are satisfied that your part in this was less than your co-accused. What you did was extremely foolish, but you have been of good character up to now. The one good thing about this case is that it has at least weaned you (we hope for good) from the drug habit. The conclusions are granted and, Smith, you are sentenced to four months' imprisonment on each of the counts which means that you are released.

In so far as McAllister is concerned, we do not accept, Mr. Begg, that all these offences were merely opportunist. It may well be that the first one was but we cannot accept that the remainder were, having regard to the short time that he was over here before these offences were committed and the method of committing them. We have no doubt that the conclusions are right and, McAllister, you are sentenced to fifteen months' imprisonment.
