JUDGMENT

THE BAILIFF: McConnachie, with some hesitation, using the words of the Attorney General, the Court is going to grant his conclusions, but I want to make it quite clear that the Court is putting you on trust to carry out the recommendations of the psychologist. If you do not and if you offend again with drugs of this nature you must expect a fairly lengthy term of imprisonment. Therefore you are placed on probation on both counts for two years, subject to the usual conditions - you have heard them recited - to be

of good behaviour to come up for sentence if necessary and to live and to work as directed by the probation officer and to undertake the treatment to which the psychologist will direct you.
