JUDGMENT

THE BAILIFF: As the Attorney General has said this is a disgraceful episode and a wanton spree causing a good deal of damage to property and distress and personal inconvenience to people. I hope that you have all learned your lesson. The Attorney General has been moderate in his conclusions and we are going to grant them, but on the next occasion that any of you appear for matters of this sort you will all expect - as far as we are concerned - to go to prison. This sort of behaviour must stop. We take into account your background; we take into account your efforts to improve yourselves; I hope you all succeed but please remember that if you do not and if you do anything like this again, you will then be of the age, most of you, to go to prison and to prison you will go.

So far as the conclusions themselves are concerned, they are granted;
AL you are sentenced to Borstal training in respect of the counts to which you have pleaded guilty; MB , you are sentenced to one year's probation in respect of the counts to which you have pleaded guilty, and 120 hours community service; both on all the counts concurrent;
JH you are sentenced also to one year's probation and you will do 60 hours of community service; PL you are fined a total of £520 or in default 11 weeks. You will pay £50 now and pay off the balance at the rate of £20 per week.
