JUDGMENT

BAILIFF: The Housing Regulations are there to be observed. You have had every opportunity to be reminded very shortly before you entered into this agreement that you had to let the unregistered accommodation to persons within a particular category. We understand what your counsel has said about pressure, but that does not really give you an excuse for failing to ensure, as it was your duty to ensure, that persons to whom you let the accommodation fulfilled the necessary Housing qualifications. Therefore we cannot see any reason why we should reduce the conclusions. You are therefore fined £1,000 or in

default six months' imprisonment with £200 costs, but you will have twelve weeks within which to pay.
