JUDGMENT

DEPUTY BAILIFF: The Court has no hesitation in granting the conclusions. Mr. Myles has been behaving in such a way as to bring disrepute on the honourable profession to which he belongs and he should be thoroughly ashamed of himself. He will be fined on each of the four charges the sum of £200 or in default of payment he will serve two weeks' imprisonment consecutively on each, making a total of £800 or eight weeks' imprisonment and he will also pay costs in the sum of £200. He shall have two weeks in which to pay.
