JUDGMENT

DEPUTY BAILIFF: . The Court agrees with the Attorney General. The Court accepts that no sanction will be effective unless and until the will to change comes from the individual.

In the meantime society - and children in particular - must be protected. The defendant can obtain help within the prison if he has the motivation to seek it and certainly on his release, if the motivation is present, he can obtain help from

the Probation Service and he can attend the psychiatric clinic as an out-patient.

In the meantime the Court will, if it has to, go on imposing increasing custodial sentences until the maximum is reached. McGregor, you are sentenced to five months' imprisonment.
