**JUDGMENT**

**THE BAILIFF:** The law does not permit us to imprison you. I think if ever there was a case which merited imprisonment, it is this.

You have defrauded your fellow citizens of over £12,000; you owe the States over £7,000, and you have been totally negligent of your duties. I wish that we did not have those restricted powers that we do, however, that is the position and we therefore grant the conclusions of the Attorney General. You are placed on probation for one year on condition you perform, to the satisfaction of your Probation Officer, 120 hours of Community Service.
