Appeal against a sentence of a fine of £200 or 3 weeks' disqualification from driving imposed on 18th May, 1995; following a guilty plea to:

1 count of driving without due care and attention, contrary, to Article 15, as amended of the Road Traffic (Jersey) Law, 1956.

Appeal allowed; period of 6 weeks substituted for 3 months' disqualification from driving.

JUDGMENT

5 THE DEPUTY BAILIFF: We want to say at the start that we feel the Magistrate was perfectly right in the comments that he made about this man's driving. This is a small island with narrow lanes and to drive in that way and in those circumstances was bound to incur a period of disqualification.

The Court, however, has had regard to your particular record in regard to the way that you have served the community and purely as an act of clemency, and not for any aberration in the decision of the learned Magistrate, we are going to reduce the period of disqualification to six weeks.
