ROAD TRAFFIC AND VEHICLES

**The Prohibition of Traffic (Drumbeg, Craigavon) Order
(Northern Ireland) 2010**

Made - - - - *10th June 2010*

Coming into operation- - *9th July 2010*

The Department for Regional Development^(a) makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 4(1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation (Northern Ireland) Order 1997^(b) and now vested in it^(c).

The Department has consulted such persons as it considered appropriate in compliance with Article 4(6) of and paragraphs 1 and 2 of Schedule 1 to that Order.

The Department has published a notice in compliance with paragraphs 1 and 3 of that Schedule.

No written objection or other representation has been received.

Citation, commencement and interpretation

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as The Prohibition of Traffic (Drumbeg, Craigavon) Order (Northern Ireland) 2010 and shall come into operation on 9th July 2010.

(2) In this Order “back street” means the back street specified in Article 2.

Prohibition

2. Subject to Article 3 the use by vehicles and pedestrians of the back street to the rear of Nos. 331-340 Drumbeg, Craigavon is prohibited.

Exceptions

3. The prohibition in Article 2 shall not apply to the use of a back street, with or without a vehicle—

- (a) by a resident of premises adjacent to the back street.
- (b) by a person who is visiting a resident of premises adjacent to the back street.
- (c) by a person for police, military, ambulance or fire and rescue purposes or in an emergency by a medical practitioner.

- (d) by a person in pursuance of statutory powers and duties by or on behalf of a government department or district council.
- (e) by a person in connection with the laying, erection, alteration or repair of any electronic communications apparatus as defined in Schedule 2 to the Telecommunications Act 1984(a).
- (f) by a person in connection with street works as defined in Article 3(3) of the Street Works (Northern Ireland) Order 1995(b).
- (g) by a person for the conveyance of goods to or from premises adjacent to the back street.
- (h) by a person in connection with the carrying out of work to premises adjacent to the back street.
- (i) by a person in connection with the discharge of the functions of a holder of a licence granted under Article 10(1) of the Electricity (Northern Ireland) Order 1992(c).
- (j) by a person in connection with the discharge of functions of a holder of a licence granted under Article 8 of the Gas (Northern Ireland) Order 1996(d).
- (k) by a person in connection with the discharge of the functions of a sewerage undertaker or a water undertaker.
- (l) by a person in connection with a funeral from premises adjacent to the back street.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order prohibits the use by vehicles and pedestrians of the back street to the rear of Nos. 331-340 Drumbeg, Craigavon.

Provision is made for access, either by vehicle or on foot, for residents, their visitors, emergency services, or any person in pursuance of statutory powers and duties, in connection with telecommunications, street works, gas or electrical work, funerals, the carrying out of work at or the conveying of goods to or from premises adjacent to the road.

Any person who acts in contravention of the Order shall be guilty of an offence under the Road Traffic Regulation (Northern Ireland) Order 1997 (“the Regulation Order”) and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale (£1,000), in accordance with the Road Traffic Offenders (Northern Ireland) Order 1996 as amended by the Regulation Order.

Traffic signs indicating the effect of the Order will in due course be erected on the road.
