**The St. Julian's Way, Omagh (Footpath) (Abandonment) Order
(Northern Ireland) 2010**

Made - - - - *17th August 2010*

Coming into operation - *20th October 2010*

The Department for Regional Development^(a) makes the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 68(1) of the Roads (Northern Ireland) Order 1993^(b) and now vested in it^(c).

The Department in accordance with Article 68(4) of that Order proposes to abandon the area of road described in the Schedule as it is no longer necessary and another road is available which provides alternative facilities.

Notice has been published, served and displayed in compliance with paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 8 to that Order.

No objection has been received.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as The St. Julian's Way, Omagh (Footpath) (Abandonment) Order (Northern Ireland) 2010 and shall come into operation on 20th October 2010.

Application

2. The area of road described in the Schedule is abandoned.

Article 2

AREA OF ROAD TO BE ABANDONED

An area of 39 square metres of footpath at St. Julian's Way, Omagh, in the townland of Mullaghmore and County of Tyrone, from a point 50 metres east of its junction with St. Julian's Road extending for 17.5 metres in an easterly direction, more particularly delineated and shown hatched on Map No. 10/1/4/10.
