**Agriculture (Student fees) (Amendment)
Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2013**

Made - - - - *18th April 2013*

Coming into operation *1st September 2013*

The Department of Agriculture and Rural Development⁽¹⁾, in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 5A(1) and (2) of the Agriculture Act (Northern Ireland) 1949⁽²⁾, makes the following Regulations:

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Agriculture (Student fees)(Amendment) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2013 and shall come into operation on the 1st September 2013.

Amendment to the Agriculture (Student fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2007

2. The Agriculture (Student fees) Regulations (Northern Ireland) 2007⁽³⁾ shall be amended as provided by regulations 3 and 4.

3. In regulation 4 (1)⁽⁴⁾ for “£1,380” substitute “£1,425”:
