George Pringle against Mark Ker.

George Pringle, having comprised certain of my Lord Borthwick's lands, intented a reduction of a prior comprising of Mark Ker's, of the whole lands of Borthwick. The defender alleged that he could have no interest by virtue of that comprising, because the solemnities appointed by the Act of Parliament, 1469, were not all used; in so far as there was no searching nor seeking for moveables upon the whole lands denounced.
