

ANNUALRENT.

1733. *November 27.*

CREDITORS of STEWART of Castlehill *against* DUNBAR of Burgie.

No. 1.

ANNUALRENT not due upon denunciation at the mercat cross of Edinburgh, if the debtor live in another shire. (See DICT. No. 119. p. 7053.)

1736. *January 7.—February 18.*

COLONEL ERSKINE *against* EARL LAUDERDALE.

No. 2.

ANNUALRENT found due for sums uplifted from a factor of a sequestrated estate by warrant from the Lords, more than what was in the event found due to the person uplifting the money.

1737. *January 13.*

CREDITORS of ANDREW ROSS and AUBREY, and OTHERS, Factors on Blackwellhall.

No. 3.

A FACTOR, who had been in use of stating annualrent to his constituent, a clothier, upon the several advances made for him, pursuing his executors for the balance of last fitted account and annualrent thereof, and for several subsequent advances for him and annualrents of them; the Lords found, that so much of the balance of the fitted account, as was composed of principal sums, continues to bear annualrent till extinguished by payment; but that so much as was composed of annualrents did not bear annualrent; and that the several advances made after that account, bear annualrent from the time of the advance.
