## ACCESSORIUM.

1750. *February 26.*

CONVEYANCE of a debt carries the adjudication as accessory.

1751. *February 28.* DAVID WILSON, Brewer, *against* ALEXANDER BURLE,  
Cordiner in Canongate.

THE same found, though the conveyance was gratuitous. No suppletory adjudication thought necessary. Why would the disponent be supposed to keep the adjudication, which could be of no use to him after he disposed the debt?

## ADJUDICATION.

1724. *February 26.* CREDITORS of BALLAGGAN.

CHARGE on adjudication not sufficient to prefer it to a subsequent infertment on a prior heritable bond.
