**ROAD TRAFFIC**

The A92/A972 Trunk Road (Private Access—Markinch Roundabout) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2010

*Coming into force*

*22nd October 2010*  
*1st November 2010*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1(1), 2(1) and 2(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

They have complied with Part II of the Secretary of State's Traffic Orders (Procedure) (Scotland) Regulations 1987(b).

**Citation and commencement**

1. This Order may be cited as the A92/A972 Trunk Road (Private Access—Markinch Roundabout) (Prohibition of Specified Turns) Order 2010 and comes into force on 1st November 2010.

**Prohibition of use of vehicles**

2. Subject to Articles 3 and 4 of this Order, no person shall use, or cause or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road specified in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order so as to make any turn specified in Part 2 of the Schedule to this Order.

The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46).

### **Permission or direction of Police Constable**

3. No provision of this Order shall apply to anything done with the permission or upon the direction of a police constable in uniform.

### **Exemption for emergency vehicles**

4. No provision of this Order shall apply to vehicles being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes.

## SCHEDULE

### PART 1

That length of the A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road southbound from a point 525 metres or thereby south of Markinch Roundabout, Glenrothes, to a point 240 metres or thereby north of Preston Roundabout, Glenrothes, a distance of 110 metres or thereby.

### PART 2

All right turns from the southbound A92/A972 Kirkcaldy – Dundee Trunk Road into the private access road 540 metres or thereby south of Markinch Roundabout, Glenrothes.
