ROAD TRAFFIC

**The M9/A90/M90 Trunk Road (Kirkliston to Scotstoun) and
M9/A9 Trunk Road (Newbridge to Winchburgh) Temporary
Prohibition of Traffic Order 2011**

Made - - - - *19th October 2011*

Coming into force - - *3rd November 2011*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1) and (2), 4(1) and 14(1)(a) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(a) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule should be prohibited because works are being or are proposed to be executed on or near those lengths of road.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the M9/A90/M90 Trunk Road (Kirkliston to Scotstoun) and M9/A9 Trunk Road (Newbridge to Winchburgh) Temporary Prohibition of Traffic Order 2011, comes into force on 3rd November 2011 and ceases to have effect on 2 November 2012.

Prohibition of use of vehicles

2. No person shall use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the lengths of road specified in the Schedule, when such prohibition is identified as applying to any part or parts of those lengths of road by means of one or more of the traffic signs prescribed in Diagram 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b).

The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c.46).

Exemption for emergency and works vehicles

3. No prohibition imposed by this Order applies to a vehicle while being used in an emergency for fire brigade, coastguard, ambulance or police purposes, or a vehicle being used for carrying out the works.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

1. That length of the M9/A90/M90 Edinburgh – Fraserburgh Trunk Road from Scotstoun Junction southwards on the main southbound carriageway of the M9/A90/M90 Edinburgh – Fraserburgh Trunk Road to its junction with the main eastbound carriageway of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road at Junction 1a Kirkliston Junction, a distance of 3.9 kilometres or thereby.

2. That length of the M9/A90/M90 Edinburgh – Fraserburgh Trunk Road from its junction with the main westbound carriageway of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road at Junction 1a Kirkliston Junction northwards on the main northbound carriageway of the M9/A90/M90 Edinburgh – Fraserburgh Trunk Road to a point 880 metres or thereby south of Scotstoun Junction, a distance of 3.4 kilometres or thereby.

3. That length of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road from a point 2.7 kilometres or thereby north west of Junction 1a Kirkliston Junction eastwards on the main eastbound carriageway of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road to a point 920 metres or thereby north of Junction 1 Newbridge Junction, a distance of 4.0 kilometres or thereby.

4. That length of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road from a point 600 metres or thereby north of Junction 1 Newbridge Junction westwards on the main westbound carriageway of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road to a point 1.1 kilometres or thereby west of Junction 1a Kirkliston Junction, a distance of 2.6 kilometres or thereby.
