ROAD TRAFFIC

The A82 Trunk Road (Glen Etive) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2015

Made - - - - *22nd December 2015*

Coming into force - - *8th January 2016*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by section 62(1) of the Roads (Scotland) Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 62(1) of that Act, they are of the opinion that considerations of public safety and convenience require that traffic on the length of road specified in the Schedule should be temporarily prohibited.

Citation and commencement

1. This Order may be cited as the A82 Trunk Road (Glen Etive) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2015 and comes into force on 8th January 2016 and ceases to have effect on 9th January 2016.

Prohibition on use of vehicles

2. No person may use or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road, or a part or parts of the length of road, specified in the Schedule to this Order when a prohibition is identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of traffic signs prescribed in Diagram 7010.1 and 7105 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 2002(b).

SCHEDULE

Article 2

SPECIFIED LENGTH OF ROAD

That length of the A82 Dalnotter – Inverness Trunk Road from its junction with the unclassified road leading to Glen Etive westwards to its junction with the Old Glencoe Road, Glencoe (Clachaig junction), a distance of 12.2 kilometres or thereby.
