**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A82 Trunk Road (Criarlarich) (Temporary 30mph Speed  
Restriction) Order 2022**

*Made* - - - - *13th April 2022*

*Coming into force* - - *23rd April 2022*

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1), 4(1) and 14(1)(b) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984<sup>(a)</sup> and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(b) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the length of road specified in the schedule should be restricted because of the likelihood of danger to the public, or of serious damage to the road, which is not attributable to works.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

In accordance with section 14(1A) of that Act, they have consulted with the affected National Park<sup>(b)</sup>.

**Citation, commencement and cessation**

1. This Order may be cited as the A82 Trunk Road (Criarlarich) (Temporary 30mph Speed Restriction) Order 2022, comes into force on 23 April 2022 and ceases to have effect on 24 April 2022.

**Speed restriction**

2. No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the length of road, or a part or parts of a length of road, specified in the schedule of this Order at a speed exceeding 30 miles per hour when a restriction is identified as applying to that length of road, or a part or parts of that length of road, by means of a traffic sign of the type described in item 1 (diagram 670 – maximum speed limit in mph) of the sign table in Part 2 of schedule 10 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016<sup>(c)</sup>.

### **Exemption**

**3.** No speed restriction imposed by this Order applies to—

- (a) vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011<sup>(a)</sup> when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations, or
- (b) vehicles being used in an emergency for coastguard purposes.

## SCHEDULE

Article 2

### SPECIFIED LENGTH OF ROAD

That length of the A82 Dalnottar – Inverness Trunk Road from its junction with the unclassified road known as Strathfillan Church Road in a generally north – westerly direction to its junction with the unclassified road known as Cononish Road, a distance of 910 metres or thereby.
