ROAD TRAFFIC

**The M9/A9 Trunk Road (Golspie) (Temporary 40mph Speed
Restriction) Order 2023**

Made - - - - 23rd October 2023

Coming into force - - 30th October 2023

The Scottish Ministers make the following Order in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 2(1), 4(1) and 14(1)(b) and (4) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and all other powers enabling them to do so.

In accordance with section 14(1)(b) of that Act, they are satisfied that the traffic on the lengths of road specified in the schedule should be restricted because of the likelihood of danger to the public, or of serious damage to the road, which is not attributable to works.

In accordance with section 14(3) of that Act, they have had regard to the existence of alternative routes suitable for the traffic which will be affected by this Order.

Citation, commencement and cessation

1. This Order may be cited as the M9/A9 Trunk Road (Golspie) (Temporary 40mph Speed Restriction) Order 2023, comes into force on 30 October 2023 and ceases to have effect on 30 April 2025.

Speed restriction

2. No person may use, or permit the use of, any vehicle on the lengths of road, or a part or parts of the lengths of road, specified in the schedule at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour when a restriction is identified as applying to those lengths of road, or a part or parts of those lengths of road, by means of a traffic sign of the type described in item 1 (diagram 670 – maximum speed limit in mph) of the sign table in Part 2 of schedule 10 of the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2016(b).

The functions of the Secretary of State were transferred to the Scottish Ministers by section 53 of the Scotland Act 1998 (c. 46).

Exemptions

3. No speed restriction imposed by this Order applies to—

- (a) vehicles falling within regulation 3(4) of the Road Traffic Exemptions (Special Forces) (Variation and Amendment) Regulations 2011^(a) when used in accordance with regulation 3(5) of those Regulations, or
- (b) vehicles being used in an emergency for coastguard purposes.

SCHEDULE

Article 2

SPECIFIED LENGTHS OF ROAD

- 1.** That length of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road at Golspie from a point 564 metres south-west of the centre line of its junction with the U2960 Ferry Road in a generally south-westerly direction to a point 910 metres south-west of that junction, a distance of 346 metres or thereby.
- 2.** That length of the M9/A9 Edinburgh – Stirling – Thurso Trunk Road at Golspie from a point 160 metres north-east of the centreline of its junction with the U3116 Sibell Road in a generally north-easterly direction to a point 1505 metres north-east of that junction, a distance of 1345 metres or thereby.
