DECISION AND REASONS

- 1. The Upper Tribunal granted the appellant permission to appeal against the decision of First-tier Tribunal Judge N. M. Paul, who dismissed her appeal against the respondent's decision to refuse to issue a residence card as the extended family member of an EEA national with reference to the Upper Tribunal decision in *Sala* (*EFMs: right of appeal*) [2016] UKUT 0411.
- 2. Upper Tribunal Judge Pitt granted permission in an order dated 21 December 2017 because the Court of Appeal in *Khan v SSHD* [2017] EWCA Civ 1755 found that *Sala* was wrongly decided. She was minded to find an error of law, set aside the decision and remit the case to the First-tier Tribunal. The Upper Tribunal gave the parties seven days from the date

- her decision was sent to file an objection to this course of action in writing. No objections to this course of action have been received.
- 3. The Tribunal finds that the First-tier Tribunal decision to dismiss the appeal for want of jurisdiction in light of *Sala* involved the making of an error of law.
- 4. The decision is set aside and the appeal will be remitted to the First-tier Tribunal for a fresh hearing.
- 5. The hearing listed in the Upper Tribunal on **31 January 2018** will be vacated.

DECISION

The First-tier Tribunal decision involved the making of an error on a point of law The decision is set aside and the appeal will be remitted for a fresh hearing
