JUDGMENT

1. The claimant's claim for unlawful deduction of wages is upheld. This amounts to £2,349.60 for wages due between November 2016 and July 2017.
2. The claimant's claim for notice pay of two weeks is upheld. This amounts to £692.
3. The respondent is ordered to pay to the claimant the sum of £3,041.60.

ORDER

Made pursuant to the Employment Tribunal Rules 2013

1. If the claimant wishes to pursue a claim for automatically unfair dismissal she must write to the Tribunal within 14 days setting out reasons why she has such a claim. Her claim form refers to being fired due to the fact that she asked for capital NMW (National Minimum Wage) and other statutory rights which may be automatically unfair dismissal under section 104 Employment Rights Act 1996.
