JUDGMENT

- 1. The correct title of the 2nd respondent is "University of Salford" and the title of the proceedings is amended accordingly.
- 2. Applying sections 53-54, 55-56, 91, 114 and 120 of the Equality Act 2010, the Employment Tribunal does not have jurisdiction in respect of the claimant's claim against the 2nd respondent and that claim is dismissed accordingly.
- 3. The application of the 1st respondent for a deposit order to be made against the claimant under rule 39 of the Employment Tribunals Rules of Procedure 2013 is refused because the Tribunal is unable to conclude at the preliminary hearing that the claim has little reasonable prospect of success.
