Decision

1. The complainant made a freedom of information request to the Department for Education (DfE) for emails held on a private email account which relate to official government business. The complainant has not received a substantive response to his request.
2. The Commissioner's decision is that the DfE has breached section 10(1) of FOIA by failing to respond to the complainant's request within 20 working days. The Commissioner requires the public authority to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.
 - State what information it holds within the scope of the complainant's request, and
 - Communicate the information it holds to the complainant and/or issue a refusal notice in respect of all or parts of the information it intends to withhold in accordance with section 17 of the FOIA.
3. The public authority must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this Decision Notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

Request and response

4. On 19 December 2011 the complainant made a freedom of information request to the DfE for copies of emails held on a private email account but which he believed would have been held on behalf the department for the purposes of the Act. The request read as follows:

"Under the freedom of information Act, please provide me with all emails from the private accounts of Mrs Blurt on matters of official government business.

Specifically, I am also seeking any emails from these private accounts that refer to the Building Schools for the Future Programme and the Sandwell Local Authority area."

5. The complainant has not received a response to his request.

Scope of the case

6. On 1 February 2012 the complainant contacted the Commissioner to complaint about the DfE's failure to respond to his request.

Reasons for decision

7. Section 1(1) of the FOIA provides that any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled-
- (a) To be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and
 - (b) If that is the case, to have that information communicated to him.
8. Section 10(1) of the FOIA provides that a public authority must comply with section 1(1) promptly and in any event not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt.
9. In this case the complainant made his request to the DfE on 19 December 2011 and has not received a response. Consequently the Commissioner finds that the DfE has breached section 10(1) of the FOIA by failing to comply with its obligations under section 1(1).

Right of appeal

10. Either party has the right to appeal against this Decision Notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
