

Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA)

Decision notice

Decision (including any steps ordered)

1. The complainant requested information concerning immigration and asylum. The Home Office failed to respond substantively to this request and the Commissioner finds that, in so doing, it breached sections 1(1) and 10(1) of the FOIA.
2. The Commissioner requires the Home Office to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.
 - Respond to the request.
3. The Home Office must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the FOIA and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

Request and response

4. On 6 July 2015, the complainant wrote to the Home Office and requested information in the following terms:

"1. How many clandestine passengers have been prevented from entering Britain illegally (that is stopped and held in Calais, Dunkirk or Zeebrugge AND at ports in Britain) in each of the past six months (January - June). I would like a figure for each month and a corresponding figure for the same period last year (2014) and in 2013 please.

2. *How many British truck drivers and haulage companies have been fined after the discovery of clandestine passengers since 2010 (giving totals for each year). What were the financial totals in each year?*
 3. *How many individuals have successfully claimed asylum in the UK since 2010 and from which countries have they come?*
 4. *How many individuals have had their claims for asylum turned down since 2010 (a figure for each year please).*
 5. *How many individuals, whose applications for asylum have been refused, are still awaiting removal?*
 6. *How much has been spent on asylum support since 2010. By asylum support I mean housing costs (accommodation in flats, houses, hostels, hotels and bed and breakfasts), money (allowances), schools and healthcare (giving a breakdown for each please)."*
5. At the time of writing the Home Office had failed to respond substantively to this information request.

Scope of the case

6. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 19 August 2015 to complain about the failure of the Home Office to respond to his information request.
7. The ICO contacted the Home Office on 8 September 2015 to raise the issue of the complainant's information request. The Home Office was notified that, if it did not respond to the request within 10 working days from that date, a decision notice obliging it to respond would be issued.
8. The Home Office did not respond.

Reasons for decision

Sections 1 and 10

9. Section 1(1) of the FOIA states that an individual who asks for information is entitled to be informed whether the information is held and, if the information is held, to have that information communicated to them. Section 10(1) of the FOIA states that a public authority must respond to a request promptly and "*not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt*".
10. In this case the Home Office has breached sections 1(1) and 10(1) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days. At paragraph 2

above the Home Office is now required to respond to the complainant's request in accordance with the FOIA.

Other matters

11. As well as the finding above that the Home Office has breached the FOIA in this case, a record has been made of the failure to respond to the complainant's information request and this issue may be revisited in future enforcement action.

Right of appeal

12. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from:
