

Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA)

Decision (including any steps ordered)

1. The complainant made a request for information relating to meetings between Croydon Council (the Council) and Crystal Palace Football Club. The request was made on 25 March 2022 and the Council has failed to provide a response.
2. The Commissioner considers that the Council has breached section 10 FOIA in the handling of this request.
3. The Commissioner requires the public authority to take the following steps to ensure compliance with the legislation.
 - Provide a response to the request in compliance with FOIA.
4. The public authority must take these steps within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of the Act and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.

Request and response

5. On 25 March 2022 the complainant made the following request for information under the FOIA for:

"Please could you provide me with the minutes of and any and all correspondence pertaining to any and all meetings (in person, on Zoom, Microsoft Teams or otherwise) held between representatives of Croydon Council - specifically [names redacted] - and representatives of Crystal

Palace Football Club in December 2021, February 2022 and March 2022.”

6. The Council has failed to provide a response to this request.

Scope of the case

7. The complainant contacted the Commissioner on 3 May 2022 and asked him to investigate whether the Council had complied with section 10 FOIA in the handling of this request.
8. The Commissioner has considered whether the Council complied with section 10 FOIA in this case.

Reasons for decision

Section 10

9. Section 10(1) provides that:

“Subject to subsections (2) and (3), a public authority must comply with section 1(1) promptly and in any event not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt.”

10. Section 1(1) provides that:

“Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled –

(a) to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and

(b) if that is the case, to have that information communicated to him.”

11. The request was made on 25 March 2022 and the Council has failed to respond to the request. This is despite the Commissioner contacting the Council on 16 May 2022 to remind it of its obligations under FOIA to respond to the request. The Commissioner therefore finds that the Council breached section 10(1) FOIA in failing to provide a response to this request.

Right of appeal

12. Either party has the right to appeal against this decision notice to the First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights). Information about the appeals process may be obtained from: First-tier Tribunal (Information Rights)
