

# Freedom of Information Act 2000 (FOIA) Decision notice

## **Decision (including any steps ordered)**

- 1. The complainant requested information about EBacc (English Baccalaureate) exams from the Board of Trustees South West Essex Community Education Trust (William Edwards School) ("the Trust"). By the date of this notice the Trust had not issued a substantive response to this request.
- 2. The Commissioner's decision is that the Trust has breached section 10(1) of FOIA in that it failed to provide a valid response to the request within the statutory time frame of 20 working days.
- 3. The Commissioner requires the Trust to take the following step to ensure compliance with the legislation.
  - the Trust must provide a substantive response to the request in accordance with its obligations under FOIA.
- 4. The Trust must take this step within 35 calendar days of the date of this decision notice. Failure to comply may result in the Commissioner making written certification of this fact to the High Court pursuant to section 54 of FOIA and may be dealt with as a contempt of court.



## **Background**

The Commissioner recognises that the request was made to the School. However, for the purposes of schedule 1 of FOIA it is the proprietor of an school, not the school itself, which is the relevant public authority. It is therefore ultimately the Trust that has the obligation to respond under FOIA. In situations where a trust is the proprietor of more than one school, the Commissioner would expect it to have processes in place to ensure that it met its FOIA obligations, regardless of whether requests were made via one of its academies or directly to the Trust itself.

### **Request and response**

- 5. On 4 March 2023, the complainant wrote to the William Edwards School and requested information about Ebacc exams (see annex).
- 6. To date, a substantive response has not been issued.

#### Reasons for decision

7. Section 1(1) of FOIA states that:

"Any person making a request for information to a public authority is entitled –

- (a) to be informed in writing by the public authority whether it holds information of the description specified in the request, and
- (b) if that is the case, to have that information communicated to him."
- 8. Section 10(1) of FOIA states that a public authority must respond to a request promptly and "not later than the twentieth working day following the date of receipt".
- 9. On 10 May 2023 the Commissioner wrote to the William Edwards School, reminding it of its responsibilities and asking it to provide a substantive response to the complainant's request within 10 working days.
- 10. Despite this intervention the Trust has failed to respond to the complainant.



11. From the evidence provided to the Commissioner in this case, it is clear that the Trust did not deal with the request for information in accordance with FOIA. The Commissioner finds that the Trust has breached section 10(1) by failing to respond to the request within 20 working days and it is now required to respond to the request in accordance with FOIA.
