THE sole question in this case is, what is the meaning of the Decree of the Court of the District Judge of Sitapur, dated the 25th November 1890, which the Appellant's predecessor obtained? The only means of construing it is to look at the Decree itself. Considering the whole matter their Lordships are of opinion that the Appellant has already received quite as much as he is entitled to under the Decree. They will, therefore, humbly advise His Majesty that the Appeal should be dismissed. The Appellant must pay the costs.
