In this case their Lordships are unable to advise His Majesty to grant special leave to appeal, solely on the ground that, in their opinion, the case comes within the 74th Section of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act. They do not desire to express, nor indeed have they formed, any decided opinion on the other points raised in argument.
