This is a mere question of fact. The learned Judges of the High Court thought that this election had not been conducted in such a satisfactory manner as to make it a true election at all. There would have to be very stringent evidence to make this Board, sitting at this distance, and not knowing the conditions, in the way in which the Judges on the spot know them, come to an opposite conclusion.

Their Lordships will humbly advise His Majesty that this appeal should be dismissed.
