In this case their Lordships find themselves in a position to state at once the advice which they will tender to the Sovereign. They have listened to a very full and admirable argument, both from Mr. Upjohn and from Mr. Simmonds, his junior, in which the real points in the appellant's case have been stated with much force; points which have received their Lordships' close attention. Their Lordships have applied the principle of Barry v. Batlin (2 Moo. P.C.C., p. 480) and Tyrrell v. Painton (L.R. 1894, P., p. 151) to the facts before them and they have considered the evidence, with the result that they see no answer to the reasoning contained in the judgment of the Court of Appeal, and, consequently, the advice which their Lordships will tender to His Majesty will be that the judgment of the Court below, allowing the appeal from Mr. Justice Woodward, should be affirmed and this appeal dismissed with costs.
