These are consolidated appeals from two decrees founded upon a judgment pronounced in the High Court of Judicature at Patna by Chief Justice Sir Edward Chamier and Mr. Justice Sharfuddin. Their Lordships have examined the judgment and the whole proceedings, including the judgment of the lower Court, with much care. They have also been favoured with a powerful challenge of the judgment. But their Lordships are clearly of opinion that the challenge fails upon all points. They think it unnecessary to call for argument in defence of the decision of the High Court, and they accordingly will humbly advise His Majesty that the appeals should be dismissed with costs.
