These appeals raise exactly the same point as the appeals of Alluri Venkatapathi Raju and another v. Dantuluri Venkatanarasimha Raju and others and cross-appeal (Privy Council appeals Nos. 55 and 56 of 1933) judgment in which has been delivered to day.

The result is that the decree of the trial Judge dismissing the suit should be restored. Their Lordships will, therefore, humbly advise His Majesty that the defendant's appeal should be allowed, and that preferred by the plaintiffs should be dismissed. The plaintiffs must pay the costs incurred by the defendant here as well as in the High Court.
