ROAD TRAFFIC

The M1 Motorway (Junction 43 to Junction 44) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - *1 September 2010*

Coming into force - *5 September 2010*

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M1 Motorway and connecting roads, in the District of Leeds in the County of West Yorkshire, is satisfied that traffic on that motorway and some of those connecting roads should be prohibited because survey and general maintenance works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the M1 Motorway (Junction 43 to Junction 44) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 5 September 2010.

2. In this Order; -

“the M1” means the M1 Motorway;

“the northbound carriageway” means the M1 northbound carriageway at Junction 43 from its diverge with the M621 Motorway (Belle Isle) northwards for a distance of approximately 2800 metres;

“the southbound carriageway” means the M1 southbound carriageway from the nose of the southbound exit slip road at Junction 44 (Rothwell Haigh) southwards for a distance of approximately 2400 metres; and

“a slip road” means the M1 southbound exit slip road at Junction 44.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 of this Order no person shall, during a period of 9 hours starting at 21:00 hours on Monday 6 September 2010 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the northbound carriageway, the southbound carriageway or a slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for traffic officer or winter maintenance purposes; or
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform.
