**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The M6 Motorway (Junction 2) (Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010**

*Made - - - - 6 September 2010*

*Coming into force - - 13 September 2010*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M6 Motorway ("the M6") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on two of those connecting roads in the County of Warwickshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as The M6 Motorway (Junction 2) (Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 13 September 2010.

2. In this Order -

"a slip road" means the slip roads leading from and to the northbound carriageway of the M6 at Junction 2.

"the works period" means the period starting at 22.00 hours on Monday 20 September 2010 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the slip road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle -

(a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;

(b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform; or

(c) being used for or in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
