**The M60 Motorway (Junctions 1-25 Anticlockwise and
Clockwise Carriageways and Slip Roads) (Temporary
Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010**

Made - - - - 2 November 2010

Coming into force - - 20 November 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M60 Motorway and its slip roads, is satisfied that traffic on sections of that motorway and on two of those slip roads in the Borough of Stockport in Greater Manchester should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M60 Motorway (Junctions 1-25 Anticlockwise and Clockwise Carriageways and Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 20 November 2010.

2. In this Order;

“the motorway” means the M60 Motorway between Junctions 1 and 25;

“the tip of the nosing of the exit slip road” means the last point where the slip road leaves the carriageway of the motorway;

“the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road” means the first point where the slip road joins the carriageway of the motorway;

“works” means survey works on a railway viaduct crossing the motorway;

“the works period” means a period between 0045 hours and 0500 hours on Sunday 21 November 2010. However, work may start and continue between the same times on subsequent nights or continue until completed, for such further period not exceeding 18 months as shall be required to complete the work;

“the first length of carriageway” means the anticlockwise carriageway of the motorway from the tip of the nosing of the exit slip road at Junction 1 to the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road at Junction 25;

“the second length of carriageway” means the clockwise carriageway of the motorway from the tip of the nosing of the exit slip road at Junction 26 to the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road at Junction 1;

“the first slip road” means the entry slip road leading to the anticlockwise carriageway of the motorway at Junction 1;

“the second slip road” means the entry slip road leading to the clockwise carriageway of the motorway at Junction 26.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the first and second lengths of carriageway or the first and second slip roads.

4. The provisions of article 3 of this Order shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any vehicle being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue or ambulance services, vehicles being used in connection with the works, or by traffic officers, or to any vehicle proceeding at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform.
