**The A21 Trunk Road (Beech House Lane – Park Lane)
(Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010**

Made - - - - 15th November 2010

Coming into force - - 4th December 2010

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A21 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be restricted and prohibited on lengths of that road because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A21 Trunk Road (Beech House Lane – Park Lane) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 4th December 2010.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A21 Trunk Road near Robertsbridge in the County of East Sussex;

“a length of trunk road” means –

- (i) both carriageways of the trunk road between its junction with Beech House Lane at Silver Hill and Northbridge Street/Robertsbridge roundabout, or
- (ii) both carriageways of the trunk road between a point 250 metres southeast of John’s Cross roundabout and its junction with the B2090 (Park Lane);

“lay-by” means an area of carriageway, intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b);

“the A21 lay-by” means the lay-by in the northbound carriageway of the trunk road between points 135 metres and 300 metres north of Northbridge Street/Robertsbridge roundabout;

“works” mean resurfacing work on the trunk road; and

“a works period” means a period of 10 hours starting at 2000 hours on Monday 6th December 2010 or on any subsequent day until 3rd June 2012.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in, or wait on, the A21 lay-by.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6 below, no person shall, during a works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding -

- (a) 10 miles per hour on a length of trunk road while traffic signs of a character authorised under section 64 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 indicating “convoy working” on those lengths of road are displayed; or
- (b) 40 miles per hour on a length of trunk road while the traffic signs specified in paragraph (a) of this article in relation to those lengths of road are not displayed.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. (1) Nothing in article 3 above shall apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, traffic officer or fire and rescue authority purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.

(2) Nothing in article 4 above shall apply to a vehicle being used for police, ambulance or fire and rescue authority purposes.
