**The M6 Motorway (Junctions 33-32, Southbound Carriageway)
(Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010**

Made - - - - 22 December 2010

Coming into force - - 8 January 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M6 Motorway is satisfied that traffic on a section of that motorway in the Borough of Wyre in the County of Lancashire should be restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M6 Motorway (Junctions 33-32, Southbound Carriageway) (Temporary Restriction of Traffic) Order 2010 and shall come into force on 8 January 2011.

2. In this Order:

“the motorway” means the M6 Motorway between Junctions 33 and 32;

“the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road” means the first point where the slip road joins the carriageway of the motorway;

“the length of carriageway” means a section of the southbound carriageway of the motorway from the tip of the nosing of the entry slip road leading from Forton Services to the centreline of Woodacre Great Wood footbridge;

“the works period” means a period starting at 2000 hours on Sunday 9 January 2011 and ending at 0600 hours on Saturday 15 January 2011. Works may start and continue beyond these dates for such period not exceeding 18 months as shall be required to complete the work;

“works” means resurfacing works on the motorway.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 of this Order, during the works period, no person shall cause or permit any motor vehicle to be driven in the length of carriageway at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour.

4. The provisions of article 3 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to a vehicle being used for emergency purposes by the police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance services or anything done at the direction of, or with the permission, of a constable, or a traffic officer in uniform.
