ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A405 Trunk Road (M1 Junction 6 - M25 Junction 21A)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

Made - - - - *31st May 2011*
Coming into force - - *18th June 2011*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A405 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic should be prohibited on a length of that road because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the A405 Trunk Road (M1 Junction 6 - M25 Junction 21A) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 18th June 2011.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the A405 Trunk Road in the County of Hertfordshire;

“the length of carriageway” means the northbound carriageway of the trunk road from its junction with the M1 at Junction 6 to the roundabout at its junction with the M25 at Junction 21A;

“Chequers Lane” means the road known as Chequers Lane at its junction with the northbound carriageway of the trunk road;

“works” mean resurfacing, reconstruction, retexturing, road marking and road stud installation work on the trunk road; and

“the works period” means the period starting on 24th June 2011 and ending on 17th December 2012.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 below, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle -

- (a) to enter or proceed in the length of carriageway; or
- (b) to enter Chequers Lane from the trunk road or to enter the trunk road from Chequers Lane.

4. The provisions of article 3 above shall apply only at such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs, and shall not apply to -

- (a) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;

(a) 1984 c.27; a new section 14 was substituted by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 (c.26), section 1(1) and Schedule 1.

- (b) a vehicle being used for police, ambulance, fire and rescue authority or traffic officer purposes;
- (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (d) any vehicle being used for winter maintenance purposes.
