**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The M50 Motorway (Junction 1) (Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

*Made* - - - - *18th July 2011*  
*Coming into force* - - *25th July 2011*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M50 Motorway (“the M50”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on four of those connecting roads in the County of Gloucestershire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M50 Motorway (Junction 1) (Slip Roads) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 25th July 2011.

2. In this Order –

“a slip road” means any slip road leading to or from the eastbound or westbound carriageways of the M50 at Junction 1;

"the works period" means the period starting at 21:00 hours on Monday 1st August 2011 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in a slip road.

4. Subject as mentioned in article 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or leave the slip roads leading to and from the westbound carriageway of the M50 at the junction with Brockridge Road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle –

- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
- (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable, or traffic officer in uniform; or
- (c) being used for or in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.
