**ROAD TRAFFIC**

**The A36 Trunk Road (Alderbury, near Salisbury) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

*Made* - - - - *21st October 2011*

*Coming into force* - - *26th October 2011*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A36 Trunk Road (“the A36”), is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road near Alderbury, Salisbury, in Wiltshire should be prohibited and restricted because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order:-

**1.** This Order may be cited as the A36 Trunk Road (Alderbury, near Salisbury) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 26th October 2011.

**2.** In this Order:

“the A36” means the A36 Trunk Road northbound, from the tip of the nosing of the northbound entry slip road at Whaddon Junction, Alderbury near Salisbury to the tip of the nosing of the northbound exit slip road at Clarendon Junction;

“tip of the nosing” means the first point where an entry slip road joins the carriageway of a trunk road or the last point where an exit slip road leaves the carriageway of a trunk road;

“the works” mean white lining and stud replacement works;

“a works period” means a period of 8 hours starting at 21.00 hours on Friday 28th October 2011 or any subsequent day and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

**3.** Subject as mentioned in article 4, no person shall, during a works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the A36.

**4** The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:

- (a) a vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
- (b) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a constable or traffic officer in uniform;

- (c) a vehicle being used for or in connection with the said works or for winter maintenance purposes.
