ROAD TRAFFIC

The M62 Motorway (Junction 27) and the M621 Motorway (Gildersome) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2010

Made - - - - 25th January 2011

Coming into force - - 31st January 2011

WHEREAS, the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M62 Motorway, the M621 Motorway, A62 Trunk Road and connecting roads, in the District of Kirklees in the County of West Yorkshire, is satisfied that traffic on one of those connecting roads should be prohibited because parapet repair and road safety barrier removal works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), makes the following Order: -

- **1.** This Order may be cited as the M62 Motorway (Junction 27) and the M621 Motorway (Gildersome) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 31st January 2011.
- **2.** Subject as mentioned in article 3 of this Order, no person shall, during a period of 8 hours commencing at 22:00 hours on Tuesday 1 February 2011 or any subsequent night thereafter until the said works have been completed, cause or permit any vehicle to:
 - (i) enter or proceed in the link road connecting M62 Motorway eastbound carriageway with the M621 Motorway clockwise carriageway between the M621 Motorway exit and entry slip roads that connect with Gildersome Northern Roundabout at Junction 27 (Gildersome), a distance of 500 metres.
 - (ii) make a right turn from the M621 Motorway clockwise exit slip road that connects with Gildersome Northern Roundabout to the A62 Trunk Road at Junction 27; or
 - (iii) make a left turn from the A62 Trunk Road to the M62 Motorway eastbound entry slip road at Junction 27.
- **3.** The provisions of article 2 of this Order shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to:
 - (a) a vehicle being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) a vehicle being used for, or in connection with, the said works, or for winter maintenance or traffic officer purposes; or
 - (c) anything done at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police officer or traffic officer in uniform.
