ROAD TRAFFIC

**The M1 Motorway (Junctions 24 - 23a) (Temporary
Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

Made - - - - 10 January 2011

Coming into force - - 17 January 2011

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M1 Motorway (“the M1”) and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that motorway and one of those connecting roads near Kegworth, in the County of Leicestershire, should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) and (7) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the M1 Motorway (Junctions 24 - 23a) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 17 January 2011.

2. In this Order:

“the motorway”	means the southbound carriageway of the M1 from the centre point of the northern bridge of the M1/A453 interchange at Junction 24 to a point 500 metres south of the centre point of Diseworth/Long Whatton Bridge (south of M1 Junction 23a);
“the slip road”	means the slip road leading to the southbound carriageway of the M1 at Junction 23a;
“the Regulations”	means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b);
“a hard shoulder”	means the hard shoulder, within the meaning of regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations, which is adjacent to the motorway;

“the works period”

means the period starting at 22:00 hours on Monday 24 January 2011 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to be driven at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour on the motorway.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the slip road.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of –

(a) articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle –

(i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes; or

(ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable; and

(b) article 4 shall not apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.

7. During the works period, regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Regulations, in respect of a hard shoulder, are hereby suspended at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
