**The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Trooping the Colour) (Amendment) Regulations 2012**

*Made* - - - 10th April 2012

*Coming into force* - - 16th June 2012

The Secretary of State deems it necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the vicinity of Charing Cross, London by reason of the Trooping of the Colour ceremony that is scheduled to take place on 16th June 2012.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by Article 161 of the Air Navigation Order 2009(a).

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Trooping the Colour) (Amendment) Regulations 2012 and come into force on 16th June 2012.

2. The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Trooping the Colour) Regulations 2012(b) are amended as follows.

3. In regulation 3(2)—

(a) in subparagraph (b), omit “or”,

(b) at the end of subparagraph (c), add “, or” , and

(c) after subparagraph (c) add—

“(d) flying with the permission of Superintendent Elaine Van-Orden or Acting Superintendent Steve Osborn of the Metropolitan Police Service”.

## **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations amend the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Trooping the Colour) Regulations 2012 (S.I. 2012/490) (“the principal Regulations”). The amendment provides a further means by which an aircraft may be exempted from the flying restrictions applicable under the principal Regulations in relation to the Trooping the Colour ceremony on 16th June 2012, by adding a further subparagraph to regulation 3(2).

Full details of the restricted airspace will be promulgated by NOTAM.
