ROAD TRAFFIC

The A5 Trunk Road (Bayston Hill Roundabout to Woodcote Roundabout, Shropshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012

Made - - - - *16th April 2012*
Coming into force - - *23rd April 2012*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A5 Trunk Road (“the A5”) is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road between Bayston Hill Roundabout and Woodcote Roundabout, south west of Shrewsbury, in the County of Shropshire, should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A5 Trunk Road (Bayston Hill Roundabout to Woodcote Roundabout, Shropshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 23rd April 2012.

2. In this Order:

“the trunk road” means the westbound carriageway of the A5 from its roundabout junction with the A49 and A5112 (Bayston Hill Roundabout) to its roundabout junction with the B4386 (Woodcote Roundabout);

“the works period” means the period starting at 20:00 hours on Sunday 29th April 2012 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 4 and 5, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed on the trunk road.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

5. The provisions of article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle –
- (a) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;
 - (b) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable; or
 - (c) being used in connection with the said works.
