ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A12 Trunk Road (Harfrey's Roundabout, Great Yarmouth to
Victoria Road Roundabout, Gorleston, Norfolk) Southbound
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012**

Made - - - - *8th May 2012*

Coming into force - - *15th May 2012*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A12 Trunk Road ("the A12") and connecting roads, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road and on one of those connecting roads in the County of Norfolk should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A12 Trunk Road (Harfrey's Roundabout, Great Yarmouth to Victoria Road Roundabout, Gorleston, Norfolk) Southbound (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 15th May 2012.

2. In this Order -

"the trunk road" means the southbound carriageway of the A12 between its junctions with William Adams Way (Harfrey's) Roundabout, Great Yarmouth and Victoria Road Roundabout, Gorleston;

"the slip road" means the A12 southbound exit slip road leading to the A143 Beccles Road, Great Yarmouth;

"lay-by" means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles, bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b); and in this definition "carriageway" means a way constituting or comprised in a trunk road (other than a cycle track) over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right;

"works" mean carriageway resurfacing and renewal of road markings;

"a works period" means a period of 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 21st May 2012 or on any subsequent day until the works have been completed;

"the works period" means the period starting at 00.01 hours on Monday 21st May 2012 and ending when the works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 4 and 5 no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in –

- (a) the trunk road or the slip road, during a works period, or
- (b) any lay-by adjacent to the trunk road, during the works period.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs.

5. Nothing in article 3 shall apply to a vehicle –

- (a) being used in connection with the works or for traffic officer purposes,
- (b) being used for police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance purposes, or
- (c) proceeding at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable, or traffic officer in uniform.
