ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A5 Trunk Road (Hockliffe, Bedfordshire)
(Temporary Prohibition of Pedestrians) Order 2012**

Made - - - 22nd October 2012

Coming into force - - 29th October 2012

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A5 Trunk Road (“the A5”), is satisfied that pedestrians on a length of that road in the County of Bedfordshire should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14(1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a), hereby makes the following Order: -

1. This Order may be cited as the A5 Trunk Road (Hockliffe, Bedfordshire) (Temporary Prohibition of Pedestrians) Order 2012 and shall come into force on 29th October 2012.

2. In this Order –

“footway” means a way comprised in a highway which also comprises a carriageway, being a way over which the public have a right of way on foot only;

“works” mean footway reconstruction;

“a works period” means a period of –

(a) 6½ hours starting at 09.00 hours on Monday 5th November 2012 or on any subsequent day (other than a Saturday or a Sunday), or

(b) 10 hours starting at 20.00 hours on Monday 5th November 2012 or on any subsequent day (other than a Saturday or a Sunday),

until the works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 no pedestrian shall, during a works period, enter or proceed in the footway adjacent to the southbound carriageway of the A5 situated between points 110 metres south and 100 metres north of the centre line of the entrance to McDonald’s Restaurant, Hockliffe.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall, from time to time, be indicated by traffic signs and shall not apply to any person –

(a) engaged in the works, winter maintenance or traffic officer service,

(a) 1984 c.27; a new section 14 was substituted by the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Act 1991 (c.26), section 1 (1) and Schedule 1.

- (b) engaged in the police, fire and rescue authority or ambulance service, or
- (c) leaving a vehicle that is prevented from proceeding by circumstances beyond his or her control.
